## Josephine Herrick Project

The Josephine Herrick Project is a 76 year old non-profit service organization that works with a range of local and national partners, including regional, city and community based organizations, schools, libraries, hospitals and social service agencies to provide free photography programs to vulnerable, under-represented and marginalized populations led by professional photographers.

For our students, the camera is a transformative tool for self-expression, community exploration and confidence building. They engage with the world through photography, tell their stories, and culminate their experience in the creation of photography books and exhibits.

The Josephine Herrick Project is the proud winner of the Lucie Humanitarian Award 2017.

## International High School at Union Square

The International High School offers a rigorous college preparatory program for English-language learners in a multicultural educational environment. The school prioritizes students of limited English proficiency who have been in the U.S. fewer than four years at the time of application. Once admitted, the students remain with the school for their entire high school career. They receive a substantive high school/college curriculum taught with a content-based English-as-a-second-language approach.
