The Josephine Herrick Project is a 76 year old non-profit service organization that works with a range of local and national partners, including regional, city and community-based organizations, schools, libraries, hospitals and social service agencies to provide free photography programs to vulnerable, underrepresented and marginalized populations led by professional photographers.

For our students, the camera is a transformative tool for self-expression, community exploration and confidence building. Students engage with the world through photography, tell their stories, and culminate their experience in the creation of photography exhibits and books.




